WHY?

- 2. <u>More than 20 SI athletes</u> have been selected to the USA Swimming JR/SR National Teams every single year since 2009.
 - 1. <u>Despite being eligible for SI assistance, 60% have never requested any LSC funding.</u>
 - Why? The National Team Assistance Program exists—largely because of revenue from Golden Goggles.
 - The less the GG's earn, the less national funding available— meaning this level of athletes, who have cost us zero dollars and have helped raise the caliber of competition in SI, would begin to turn to us for assistance.

- 3. SI will already be in Denver for ABM. With the dates for both events coinciding for the first time ever, the only cost to us would be what we decide to donate to the National Team in seat purchases.
 - 1. GG's have always had dates & locations requiring travel/lodging expenses beyond costs from the event itself—which is why SI hasn't supported the event in the past.
- 4. Multiple other LSC BODs choose to support this event–and our SI national teamers–every year. Why haven't we?
 - 1. ex. SoCal, Pacific, Indiana, Colorado, Hawaii, Metropolitan, Arizona, Utah, & many more
- 5. Huge opportunity to expose SI to elite-level talent from around the country.
 - 1. LSCs with the fastest swimmers in the country attend GGs.
 - If properly planned, SI attendees can help attract the best of the best to SIsponsored Championship meets
 - Would provide a direct benefit to <u>all</u> SI swimmers—not just SI-affiliated National Teamers.
 - Teams wouldn't go elsewhere for elite competition if more of it was in their own backyard.
